#### **DEEP DIVE SESSIONS**

**Description:** These intensive sessions blend fun, engaging content with a richer, more in-depth exploration of the most challenging issues facing after school program staff. Join us as we go deep, building reflective practice and making best practices and inspiring ideas into realistic, feasible changes to your programs. Build expertise and skill that will translate into improved outcomes for your children, your families, and your program!

Title: De-Escalation: How to Respond to Defiant Children and Overwhelming Situations Date: October 17, 2015

Positive behavior management strategies are intended to help children make good choices. But what about children who continuously struggle? How do you handle situations where a child is fighting, running, screaming, destroying things, or otherwise endangering him/herself or others? Serious behavioral issues are a missed opportunity. Instead of trying to contain or manage the problem, we could and should be equipping children for happiness and success in after school and in life. In this intensive Deep Dive session, we'll take a close look at why children escalate and how to deescalate them, including hands-on, powerful tools and approaches that turn the most challenging behaviors into meaningful opportunities for lasting growth and social-emotional learning while keeping children and staff safe.

Title: The Well-Managed Schools®: A Practical, Strength-Based Approach to Classroom Date: December 18, 2015

Management

In this session, after school staff will receive an overview of strategies on how to set students up for success, catch them being good, and correct their inappropriate behavior. Participants will be introduced to a social skills curriculum that serves as a guideline for setting expectations and teaching appropriate social replacement behaviors. In addition, staff will hone their skills in order to foster communication with the home thereby assisting students with generalization of the skills learned in the classroom.

Title: ADHD: Going Deeper Date: February 11, 2016

ADHD is one of the most frequent diagnoses in young people, and can be befuddling and overwhelming to adults. Understand the diagnosis better, separate myth from fact, and explore concrete strategies for helping children learn self-regulation and focus while building self-esteem. In this Deep Dive, we'll take a closer look at tools and strategies to support children with ADHD and their families, ways to build empathy and structure your program to support the success of all children, and ways to make sure you're not just getting through the day, but helping each child move forward and develop into a happy, successful person!

Title: Autism: Going Deeper Date: March 12, 2016

Diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorders is on the rise, and the diagnosis itself has just changed dramatically. Learn what Autism is and explore the vast array of different elements of this complex diagnosis. Explore research based strategies to support success. In this Deep Dive, we'll take a closer look at tools and strategies to support children with Autism Spectrum Disorders and their families, ideas for welcoming students on the spectrum and helping them engage peers, discuss methods to advance children along their developmental trajectories in lasting, meaningful ways.

Title: Having Tough Conversations with Parents Date: April 7, 2016

Strong, collaborative relationships with parents are essential to happy, successful children. But unfortunately, sometimes we have to talk with parents about things we know they don't want to hear. Sometimes, a parent isn't on board with setting boundaries or supporting educators when they try to make a difference. Sometimes, we have to talk about serious issues in the program or classroom that a parent seems to be in denial about. In this Deep Dive, we take a look at what lies behind this resistance, disinterest, and denial, and how to move through it with parents, building bridges to help children succeed in after school and in life. Title: The Tough Emotions: Understanding and Managing Anger & Fear

Children who have survived trauma often have strong feelings of anger and fear. These feelings can be mixed, and are often turned against a third party or turned inward, on the self. What's more, we often fail to teach children appropriate ways to deal with tough feelings like anger and fear, making it challenging not just for children who've survived trauma, but for a majority of our children, to move through these difficult and unpleasant emotions. In this Deep Dive, learn to help children become more aware of their own emotional processes, and to develop healthy, constructive ways of processing and managing their strong feelings. Help children learn healthy pathways to self-regulation and self-actualization, and equip them for a healthier, happier life.

#### COACHING & LEARNING FOR AFTER SCHOOL PROFESSIONALS (CLASP)

**Description:** The Connecticut After School Network is launching two year-long intensive learning cohorts focused on increasing student engagement through intentional programming that helps support student success. We will be offering 12 slots in two locations (6 in each) for 2015-16 sessions designed for those overseeing sites or programs. Content will be focused on program design elements that meet program goals and embed academic content into afterschool pedagogy.

Each cohort will meet four times (full day sessions) throughout the course of the year (November, January, March, and May). Dates for the 2015-16 academic year are listed below. Participants will also receive additional materials and resources throughout the year. The emphasis of the CLASP program is to provide resources and support through coaching and learning that help to change practice.

Title: Increasing Student Engagement: Youth Interest and Voice to Develop Intentional Programming Increasingly the evidence is becoming clear, after school programs contribute to student achievement (Bennett, 2013; Vandell, 2013). The research identifies programs and practices in which youth voice and student interest correlate to social, emotional, and academic gains. The CLASP Sessions will aim to relate this to the program experience of participants. Expert facilitators will help create a dialogue that is meaningful and effective to the cohort through coaching and learning. The sessions will also help participants examine, share, and learn about each other's practices in the field, and how to refine their own programs.

Description: The Connecticut After School Network has partnered with the California Afterschool Resource Center to provide free online learning modules. The courses listed below are a small sample of over 50 modules staff can take. Each module contains information that can help new hires and frontline staff be better equipped in their position. Title: Understanding Child and Adolescent Development

Learn to recognize what students may and may not be able to do at various stages with regard to physical abilities, communication, thinking and social skills. Based on this information, participants will obtain tips for providing appropriate activities for students of varying ages and ability levels. A special focus will be placed on providing activities that build physical and language development, as well as social skills.

Title: Connecting with Students Through Read-Alouds

Learn to identify the main goals, benefits, and guidelines for reading aloud with students. Participants recognize key criteria for selecting high-quality multicultural literature to engage diverse learners, and obtain fun, literature-based ideas for reinforcing comprehension and vocabulary skills.

Title: Making Sense of Math

Learn about key considerations in the teaching and learning of mathematics. Participants recognize the components of balanced math instruction, and examine how skills are organized in the Mathematics Framework and Common Core State Standards. Tips for using manipulatives, literature, and making math meaningful are included.

Title: Hands-On STEM Series

This two-part series begins with "Explore It", in which participants learn about the interdisciplinary nature and importance of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM). Participants recognize six recommended practices for supporting STEM, and get introduced to the 5 Es Inquiry Learning Model. In "Dig In", learn the purpose and key features of inquiry-based learning. Participants explore the phases of the 5 Es Inquiry Learning Model.

Title: Career Education Nuts and Bolts

This module grounded on the Career/Technical Education Framework provides simple tips and resources to support students in building career readiness in after school programs. Participants explore the purpose, importance, and progression of career education. Additionally, participants obtain ideas for engaging the community in helping students to build career readiness from an early age.

Title: Career Readiness Tools

This module explains the purpose and importance of career education, and provides simple activities to prepare students for the work world. Participants examine the connection between academic and other job-related skills, and explore the importance of high-demand skills in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM). In addition, participants consider salaries and job satisfaction as key factors in helping students choose occupations.
