Designing Useful Indoor After School Space (Charter Oak)

Working in after school programs we often find ourselves using awkward spaces, cafeterias, gymnasiums, libraries, etc...; in many cases we find that these spaces work against us rather than for us. And yet these spaces can be turned into amazing after school environments with just a few simple tweaks. We will look at the needs of your students, your program, and your staff and how the design of your space can work for you. We will focus on design that is welcoming, provides youth choice and self-directed opportunities, and creates an SEL empowered out of school time learning environment.

Partnerships, grant funding, and collaboration will be covered in this session as well as real world examples from peers.

Staff turnover has never been higher in the field. While it has impacted the day-to-day operations of afterschool programs, it has also provided opportunities for growth for seasoned staff. REBUILDING THE FIELD WEBINAR SERIES

Description: Throughout the pandemic, the Connecticut After School Network provided these webinars for relevant and current information to help programs plan ahead and learn what peers were doing related to a topic. With staffing, grant funding, and program quality pulling leaders in different directions, these webinars serve as grounding points to help take a pause and consider critical issues programs statewide and nationally are dealing with. Professional Development Planning with Impact

Research shows that high quality professional development has a direct impact on student outcomes. How our staff interact with and build positive relationships matters. Frontline and Direct Service staff have the largest opportunity to connect with children and families, but often do not have clear direction or training to do this effectively. In this session we will discuss the importance of professional development planning with staff to maximize the potential benefits of your programs.

Should I care? Advocacy is more than funding.

"My program doesn't get state or federal funding, why should I care?" is a common question asked in advocacy sessions. The answer to this question is community. While funding may spur innovation or quality improvement, it does not preclude these things from happening elsewhere. Sharing our experiences, models, and challenges with one voice not only helps with state and federal funding streams, it also provides context for a larger public understanding of what afterschool and summer programs are all about. Join us for this exciting webinar and learn how you can have your voice heard.

What is SOLD and how can the children in my program benefit?

As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, children need more social, emotional, and academic support. The Science of Learning and Development (SOLD) provides a framework that helps afterschool and summer programs take a holistic approach to curriculum development and program delivery. Hear from out-of-school time leaders that have used this framework and the impact it has had on their communities.
